Literary Terms

Simile- a figure of speech that compares two things using the words "like" or "as".

Ex. The ice was as smooth as glass.

Metaphor- a figure of speech that compares two things **without** using the words "like" or "as".

Ex. The cup of **tea was** the best **medicine** for my cold.

Hyperbole- an extreme exaggeration used for emphasis. Ex. I could eat a horse!

Allusion- a reference to a well-known person, place, thing, or event. Ex. He thought he was **Superman**.

Alliteration- the repeating of beginning consonant sounds. Ex. The peanut butter was **cr**unchy and **cr**eamy.

Personification- a figure of speech in which a nonhuman thing (an idea, object, or animal) is given human characteristics.

Ex. The stars **winked** in the night sky.

Repetition- the repeating of a word or phase to focus on an idea. Ex. "He squeezed, and squeezed, and squeezed." *Freak the Mighty*

Onomatopoeia- the use of a word whose sound makes you think of its meaning.

Ex. boom, swish, crack, hiss, or zip.

Irony- using a word or phrase to mean the exact opposite. Ex. I love cleaning my bedroom.

Idiom- words used in a special way that may be different way from their literal meaning.

Ex. It's raining cats and dogs.

Imagery- using language to produce a picture in one's mind (focusing on the five senses).

Ex. I felt the heat of the sun reflecting off the bright red convertible.
